

# PEORIA TEAM TENNIS RULES 2014-2015

## ADVANCED LEAGUE

### RULES FOR LEAGUE

1. All matches are one 10 game set, with players changing ends after 6 games. If scores are level at 9 games each, a 7-point tiebreaker will be played. All games are AD SCORING.

**7 POINT TIE-BREAKER:** Keep service rotation and switch sides after 6 points. Serve 1, switch servers, serve 2, switch servers, serve 2, switch servers, serve 1, switch ends, and repeat. The person who did the last 'serve 1' gets to start at this end with another 'serve 1'. First to 7 points wins, with **2-point difference required**.

2. All tiebreakers count as one game, i.e. teams winning the tiebreaker win the match 10-9.

3. Teams play each other in 3 matches, men's doubles and two mixed doubles matches.

4. If a team uses a substitute, the opponent receives a 1 game award, per match.

5. At the end of nights play, the team which wins the most sets, wins the "meet".

6. At the end of the season, the winner of a division is determined as the team that wins the most meets. If two teams end up with same number of wins, the following order is used to break the tie:

number of wins -> number of games won -> mixed doubles wins

7. Any disputes will be ruled on by the Team Tennis Coordinator, whose decisions will be final.

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## NORMAL LEAGUE

### RULES FOR LEAGUE

1. All matches are one 8 game set, with players changing ends after 6 games. If scores are level at 8 games each, a 7-point tiebreaker will be played. All games are NO-AD SCORING.

At Deuce, the receiving team must pick which person receives the serve. However, in Mixed doubles, it must be served to same gender.

**7 POINT TIE-BREAKER:** Keep service rotation and switch sides after 6 points. Serve 1, switch servers, serve 2, switch servers, serve 2, switch servers, serve 1, switch ends, and repeat. The person who did the last 'serve 1' gets to start at this end with another 'serve 1'. First to 7 points wins, with **2-point difference required**.

2. All tiebreakers count as one game, i.e. teams winning the tiebreaker win the match 10-9.

3. Teams play each other in 4 matches, men's doubles, women's doubles, and two mixed doubles matches.

4. If a team uses a substitute, the opponent receives a 1 game award, per match.

5. At the end of nights play, the team which wins the most sets, wins the "meet". If the meet is tied at 2-2, a super tiebreak is played. That procedure is below.

**SUPER TIE-BREAKER:** Both teams agree on type based on persons still available (mens doubles or womens doubles or mixed). Teams also choose which players shall play in the tiebreak. The teams then play a single 7 point tiebreaker to decide the meet.

6. At the end of the season, the winner of a division is determined as the team that wins the most meets. If two teams end up with same number of wins, the following order is used to break the tie:

number of wins -> number of games won -> mixed doubles wins

7. Any disputes will be ruled on by the Team Tennis Coordinator, whose decisions will be final.
